- Received funding to support the work of the BRDC, funding proposals emphasize that the recommendation for the fate of the dams will:
 - Be a community driven process
 - Will establish a new benchmark for outreach, education and community involvement
 - Include development of a national model with transferability to other communities
- Developed thorough and workable organizational structure
- Developed Statement of Purpose:
“To engage all interests in assessing and recommending the fate of the dams on the main stem of the Boardman River based upon a thorough analysis of options, including long and short-term economic, social, environmental, aesthetic, transportation and ecological impacts upon the community, individuals and riparian owners.”
- Developed Communications Strategy
- Created Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for Engineering and Feasibility study, which resulted in 12 submissions
- Using the Qualifications Based Selections (QBS) process, RFQ’s were reviewed and narrowed selected firms to 3
- Developed interview strategy
- Selected an engineering firm to conduct Engineering and Feasibility study
- Developed Scope of Work
